





Eastleigh Borough Council is set to make a decision about **Southampton Airport's** planned runway extension this month. Local Green campaigner **Katherine Barbour**, with the support of **Southampton Greens**, will be watching this decision process closely

as approval would have a big impact on the residents of **Portswood** and **St Denys**. **Katherine** says, **"I fear for the future of this city if this decision goes in favour of the airport. I dread to think what it will be like with even bigger aircraft."**

KATHERINE WORKS TIRELESSLY TO HELP PEOPLE WITH DEMENTIA AND THEIR CARERS

During the first lockdown, local Green campaigner, **Katherine Barbour**, started a weekly soiree online for dementia sufferers and their carers. This gathering has now been meeting for a year. People living with Dementia and their carers meet, have a chat, listen to music and share time together.

She knows some people are not able to access services online so she also started producing a fortnightly magazine called 'Together We Stand'. This is now produced monthly and features stories, pictures, quizzes, recipes and where to go to get help during lockdown.

Katherine coordinates the delivery of the magazine to over 200 people across Southampton. Caraway and the Admiral Nurses help and support this work.

Birgitt and Peter of **Portswood** say, “**Together We Stand is a great magazine and we look forward to receiving it from Katherine.**”
